PREFACE

Brigham Young University's football team in 1947 won only three games out of a ten game schedule. Two were lost by two point margins and two by one touch-down margins. The team was dogged all season by injuries to key players at the most inopportune times. However, the Cougars are offering no excuses.

The 1948 BYU machine seems to have the makings of a competent grid outfit. The talent will be just a little better distributed through the different positions in both the line and backfield, there will be a little more speed and the usual abundance of Cougar fight and determination.

The squad may not be the greatest in Cougar history, but it will have color, drive, a wide open style of play—the T is still in vogue at BYU— and a hankering after better days. A good many people around Provo wouldn't be greatly surprised to see Cougars perched in a rather nice position in point of games won and lost when the last gun has sounded.

While Eddie Kimball, head coach, has lost such men as Fielding Abbott, captain and center of the 1947 machine; Glen Oliverson, fullback; Rex Olsen, passing quarterback deluxe; Mike Mills and Jim Kietzman, stand-out ends, and Max Shiffer and Stan Stapley, guards, he will have an unusually fine freshman squad to draw from for replacements.

Indeed, it is very likely that the thing which will make or break the 1948 Cougar football season will be the way the men up from the greenling squad come through in varsity competition.

EDWIN R. "Eddie" KIMBALL . . .



. . . Head Coach

In charge of Brigham Young University's football fortunes this year is the veteran Edwin R. "Eddie" Kimball, who is also director of athletics.

Eddie played for BYU in 1923, 1924 and 1925, being captain of the team in his senior year. He entered the coaching game at Millard county high school on graduating. While there he produced three division champions in football and two in track.

Later, while coaching at Jordan high school, he coached two state championship grid teams, one which also won the southwest championship.

In 1934 Kimball was awarded a master's degree in physical education at the University of Southern California. He came then to the BYU coaching staff, and after three years succeeded G. Ott Romney as head coach and director of athletics.

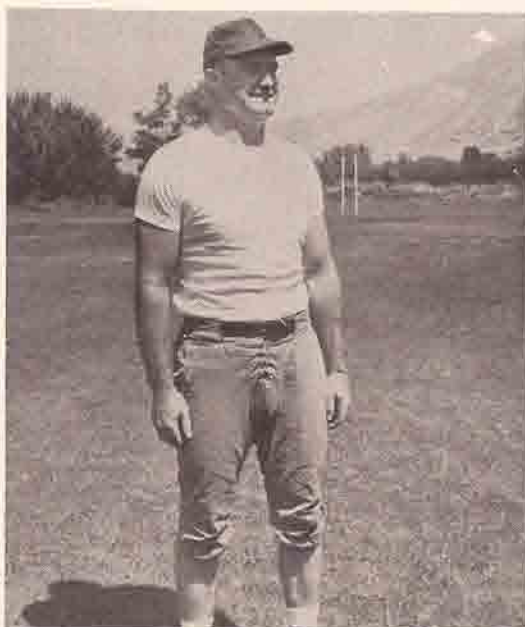
The likeable mentor was granted a military leave of absence from 1942 to 1946, during which he served with the U. S. Navy. His administrative abilities and general all-round qualifications were good enough so that he was placed in charge of physical, military and survival training for all navy aviation from San Diego through the Aleutian islands. His work brought letters of commendation from the secretary of the navy and the commander in chief of the Pacific fleet.

Eddie brought the T system back to BYU with him and began using it in rebuilding a team which had been inactive during the war years.

His coaching record at the "Y" shows 29 games won, 26 lost and 7 tied.

WAYNE SOFFE . . .

. . . Assistant Football Coach



Husky Wayne Soffe counts the 1948 season as his tenth year on the Brigham Young University coaching staff.

Congenial and conscientious, Soffe believes in getting things done well and has helped to keep the line play of BYU grid teams at a high standard.

Soffe was graduated from Jordan high school in 1934 after an outstanding athletic

career which saw him named on several allstate football and basketball teams. In 1937 he was captain of the BYU football team and was named on a majority of the all-conference teams for his performance at an end position.

He was graduated from BYU in 1938 with a bachelor degree and in 1940 earned a master of science degree, also in physical education and from BYU.

From 1942-46 he served as athletic and military training officer for C. H. S. U. 33 in the U. S. Navy.

Since much of the success of any football machine depends on the efficiency with which its line functions, on Soffe's shoulders will fall one of the most important jobs of the staff. His ability to teach the exacting technique of line play and his success in building morale among the usually unnoticed "seven mules" who make up the line as counted on to guarantee that this important aspect of a team's play will be well up to par.

STAN WATTS . . .

. . . Assistant Football Coach



Capable and likeable Stan Watts this year will be assigned to the varsity staff in football, with his principal job to be coaching backfield men.

Watts last year handled the freshman team, one of the best greenling outfits in recent years at BYU. He directed varsity baseball last spring, turning out a divisional championship outfit.

Stan began his athletic career at Murray high school, where he earned letters in football, basketball and baseball before graduating in 1928. After being out of school for a time he enrolled at Weber junior college, Ogden, and turned in an amazing record in varsity competition, getting letters in football, basketball and track.

Transferring to Brigham Young University, Watts concentrated on football and basketball, being a blocking back in the former and forward in the latter.

He began his coaching career at Millard county high school in 1938-41, then went to Dixie junior college, St. George, where he coached all varsity sports. He went next to Jordan high school as head basketball coach and assistant football coach. He came to BYU in 1947.

REED NILSEN . . .

. . . Assistant Coach--Head Freshman Coach



One of the best linemen who ever wore a Cougar uniform, Reed Nilsen will be moving into his first full-time football coaching assignment when he takes over the freshman squad this fall.

Nilsen played his prep football at Provo high school, where he was named all-state fullback in his senior year. He then moved up to Brigham Young University and was shifted to center, where he

became a mainstay for Cougar teams on which he played. He was named all-conference center in 1946.

From 1943 to 1946 he served as an officer in the U. S. Navy, landing in Normandy on D-Day as commander of an LCT.

In 1947 he played in the East-West all-star game and also played professional football for the Detroit Lions.

A fine wrestler during his college days, he served as wrestling coach last winter at BYU and will continue to coach that sport.

Nilsen's professional football background, plus the fine competitive spirit which he showed as a player and is continuing to show as a coach, should make him one of the most useful members of the football coaching staff. He will also be useful in scouting assignments and in special assignments with the varsity.

DAVE CROWTON

. . . Assistant Coach



Moved up from BY high school where his basketball team last year won the state Class B championship, Dave Crowton this year will be assistant freshman coach as well as assuming a number of special assignments on the coaching staff.

Dave was graduated from Granite high school in 1930 after participating in all major sports there and receiving all-state honors in basketball and

football. He captained his school's state championship team in his final year.

He was graduated from Brigham Young University in 1937, having lettered in basketball before injuries hampered his athletic activities.

On graduation he became coach at BY high school and compiled an enviable record in both football and basketball.

Crowton spent 1943 as director of physical education and recreation at the Japanese Relocation Center in Topaz, Utah.

With his wide range of experience, both as a player and as a coach, Dave should find plenty of things to do on the Y sports staff. His first coaching assignment will be as assistant freshman coach.

FLOYD MILLET . . .



. . . Scout

Head coach in basketball —incidentally, he had a conference championship team last year — Floyd Millet also doubles during the football season as chief scout.

Millet came to BYU in 1931 from Gila Junior college at Thatcher, Ariz. On the football field he played a heady and steady game at fullback. In track he was state collegi-

ate broad jump champion.

In basketball, his specialty, Millet gained all-conference honors for two years at a forward position. His teams reached the conference championship playoffs in his junior and senior years. In his last year he won western division scoring honors.

In 1937 Floyd became head track coach and assistant grid coach. In 1939 he was named assistant basketball coach, and moved into the headman's spot in that sport in 1941.

He was graduated from BYU with a degree in physical education in 1933 and earned a master of science degree, also in physical education, at the University of Southern California in 1939.

RODNEY KIMBALL . . .

. . . Trainer and Equipment Manager

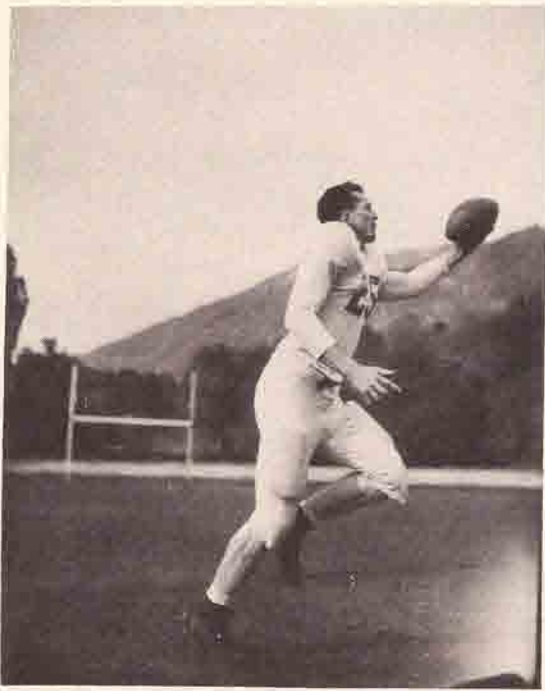


On the capable shoulders of Rodney Kimball falls the task of keeping injuries at a minimum and speeding the healing of those that do develop. He is also in charge of equipment.

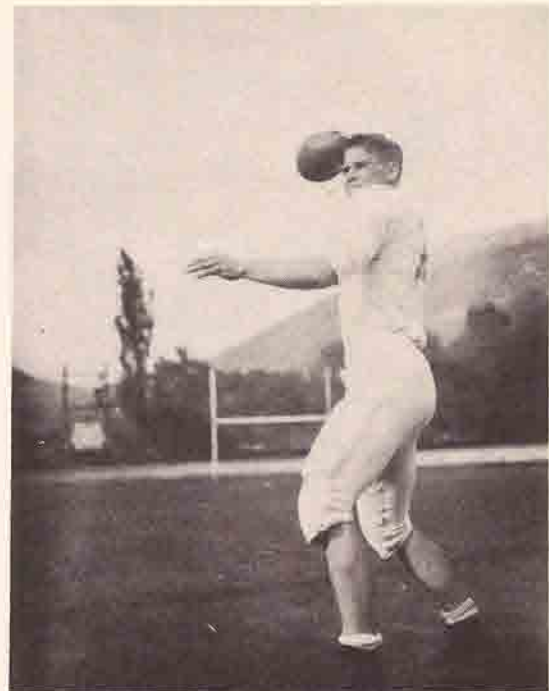
Rod came back to BYU last year after an earlier period as trainer from 1937-42.

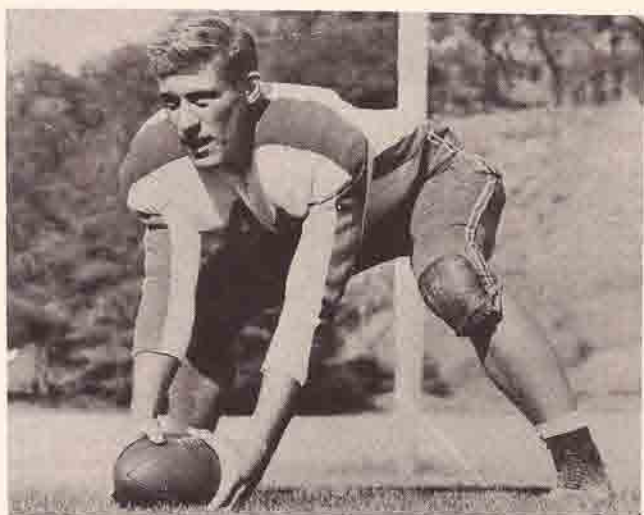

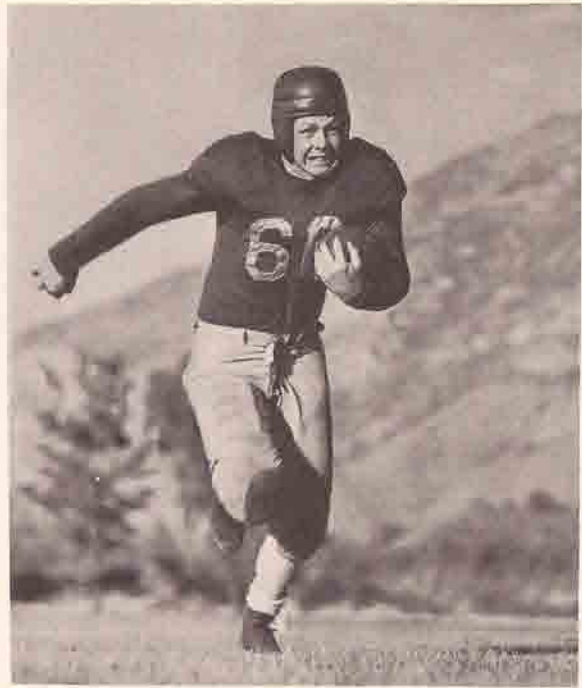

THUMB-NAIL SKETCHES OF PLAYERS

AITKEN, RAY, Tackle - Husky physical major who got in considerable play last year at guard. May be shifted to tackle in an effort to use his size and experience. Fast and heady player.

ANDERSON, LORENZO, Guard - Got his prep football experience at Palatka High School in Florida. Played fullback on the frosh team last year, but is being drafted for line duty this year to utilize his defensive abilities.

BENSON, DON, Fullback - Former all state fullback from Las Vegas, Nevada. Weighing close to the 200 pound mark, "Big Ben" is also remarkably fast. Good ball carrier, blocker; strong defensively.

BERRY, REX, Halfback - Moving up from Jaycee competition, where he was a star at Carbon College, Price. His speed and elusiveness in the open field are expected to bolster the Cougars in that department.

BILLS, KAROL, Tackle - Former star center at BY High School, who starred on the Cougar frosh squad team last year at tackle. Smart, tough boy who should play a lot of football.

BOULTER, ROY, Tackle - Nicknamed "Rock", Boulter is a junior planning to major in business at BYU. He has been active in track as well as in football. Lettered last year as a sophomore.

BUSHORE, DON, Quarterback - One of the veterans of the squad, Bushore will be playing his third season for the Cougars. At 23 he has served with the Navy, where he played service football, and has carved out a distinguished record in BYU athletics. He was also one of the regulars on the Y's division champions in baseball last spring.

CHADWICK, DAVE, Halfback - Cougar coaches hope Chadwick will be able to convert some of his track speed to good purpose on the gridiron. The speedy Idaho prep star has been clocked at 9.8 in the hundred yard dash. Injuries kept him from showing his wares fully as a freshman. His followers claim he has everything that goes to make a great back except the seasoning.

CLARK, GLEN, End - Has earned letters as halfback, but is being given a whirl at end play this year. Plays a driving game on both offensive and defensive and should do much to bolster a spot hit hard by graduation of Mills and Kietzman.

DALLEY, ALVIN, Guard - Played a lot of time last year as center. Slated to play guard this year where his great defensive work can be utilized more fully. Outstanding wrestler. Comes from Driggs, Idaho and is majoring in physical education.

DEEDS, SCOTTY, Halfback - One of the best backs in the Rockies during the past few seasons, Scotty is expected to be back in top form for the 1948 season, his last in the Cougar uniform. Fast, elusive and shifty, he can add a lot of punch to the Y attack.

THUMB-NAIL SKETCHES OF PLAYERS (Continued)

DIMICK, BOB, Guard - A regular guard on the frosh team last year, Dimick is a physical education major. In addition to being a hustling, aggressive lineman, Bob is also a capable basket ball player.

DUERDEN, VERL, Quarterback - Newcomer to the varsity ranks, Duerden rounds out a trio of promising quarterbacks. An excellent ball handler, he hails from Salt Lake City and is expected to get in a considerable share of playing time.

ECCLES, JIM, Quarterback - Nicknamed "Hermit", Eccles lettered in football at Woodrow Wilson High School in Long Beach, Calif. Interested in journalism, with some notion of becoming a sports writer. Skilled ball handler, excellent passer and good blocker.

HAMBLIN, JAY, Halfback - Letterman at halfback, Jay claims Murray, Utah, as his home town. Driving back who is also good pass receiver.

HAMBLIN, KEN, Guard - Earned letter at guard on last year's team. Weighs near the 200 pound mark. Played for South High School in Salt Lake City during prep school days.

HILL, DICK, Center - Regular center on freshman team last year. Prepped at Carbon High School in Price. A hustler, and good team man, Hill is rated especially strong on defense.

HOLT, GAYLE, Tackle, At 6'4" one of the tallest men on the squad, Holt is a veteran tackle who was one of the starting regulars last year. He's another letterman who also claims basketball among his interests. Intends to major in business.

KIMBALL, TIM, Tackle - Rated one of the darkhorse contestants for a regular tackle spot. Injuries as a freshman last year kept him slowed down, but was back in form during spring practice. Played on the West High School Big Nine championship team while a senior at the Salt Lake City school.

KOLLER, LYLE, Halfback - One of the backfield regulars last season, Koller is expected to see a lot of play again this year. Did a good share of the punting last year and is expected to repeat again this year. A physical education major, he is also a topnotch baseball player.

LLOYD, CECIL, Halfback - One of the faster backfield men and a semi-regular during the latter part of last season, "Cec" came to BYU from Preston, Idaho, where he won state honors as a low hurdler. Has also been active in boxing and basketball.

LONG, ROD, End - Kept out of play last year with a shoulder injury, Long is given a good chance to rate a starting end position. Specializes in pass snagging. Trackman in addition to football. A physical education major, Rod got his prep training in Elko, Nevada, but now claims Draper, Utah, for his home town.

MAGLEBY, DICK, End - Hailing from Los Angeles, Dick earned a letter at end last year with the Cougars. Is expected to be one of the top candidates again this year.

MERRILL, KIMBALL, Tackle - Known as "Moose" to his teammates, Merrill played outstanding ball last year and at the end of the season was elected captain of the 1948 aggregation. Another of the many fine football players who have come to BYU from Arizona, Merrill was an all-state end in football and an all-conference basketball guard at North Phoenix High School. He is majoring in physical education.

OSBORNE, BRUCE, Fullback - A senior in physical education, Osborne was regular fullback last year. He has earned one letter in football at Utah State and two at BYU. Exceptionally fast for a big man.

PATTON, LYLE, Guard - West Virginia's contribution to the Y football cause. Reserve guard last year, Lyle is small but makes up for it in fight and aggressiveness. Junior this year.

SMITH, WILLIAM D., Guard - Hails from Kemmerer, Wyoming. Played lots of service football while with the U.S. Army in the European theater during World War II. A sophomore this year, he was kept from showing his wares last year by a knee injury.

STONE, THANE, End - Former all-state end at Spanish Fork High School, Stone this year will be topping off three years of football competition at BYU. One of the best defensive ends in the Mountain States conference.

THIEL, TED, Fullback - Converted from quarterback, a spot at which he played a reserve role last year, Thiel is expected to be hard to keep out of a starting fullback job. A member of the championship basketball squad last year. Ted went on in the spring to become the slugger on the baseball team. He brings size, speed and competitive spirit to whatever role he is asked to fill.

TREE, MARION, Guard - A regular guard last year, Tree has been rated by many as the best football player, pound for pound, in the conference. He is a determined and smart defensive man. Other sports activities include varsity wrestling.

VAN NOY, DEAN, End - An all-state end while at Star Valley High School in Wyoming. Good on both offensive and defensive. Rated one of the better freshman prospects.

WEIDAUER, ARNOLD, End - Sophomore end candidate and tallest man on the squad. Played tackle on Granite state championship team, but has been shifted to end to utilize his height. Strong defensive man also.

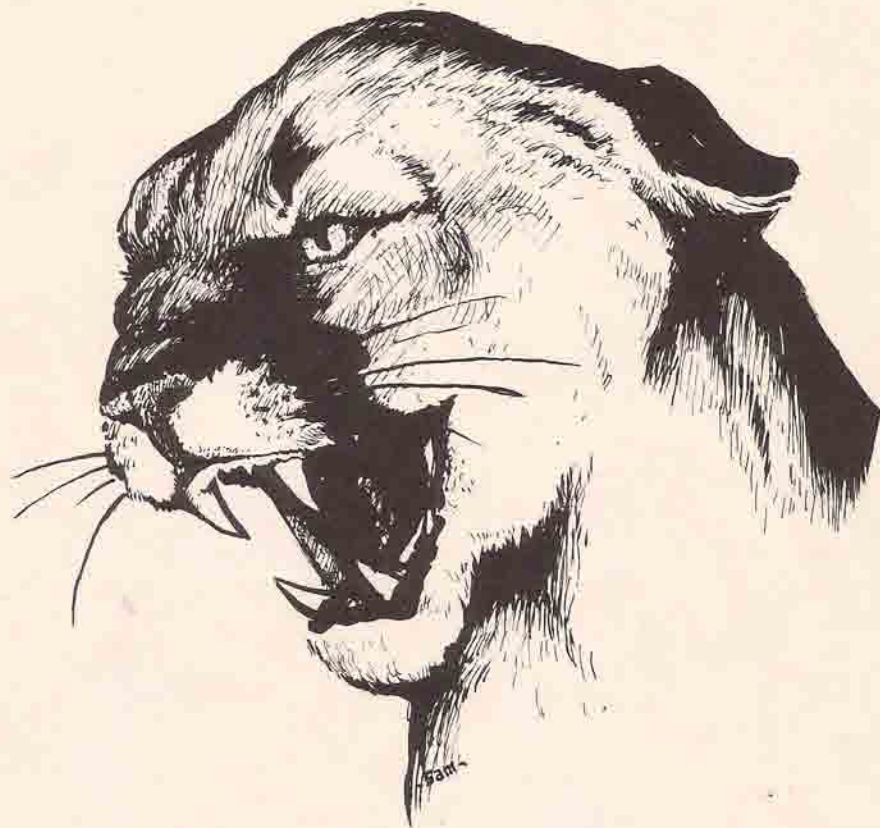
